Plans for Azuma Stadium Renovation take shape as Part of Tokyo 2020 Baseball and Softball Preparations

The 4th meeting of the Tokyo 2020 Games-related Projects Task Force, a meeting of all the prefectural government departments, took place on Monday, January 29th. At the meeting, the governor of Fukushima (Chairperson), the vice-governor (vice-chairperson), and the head of each department approved the plans for the renovation of Azuma Stadium.

The director general of the Culture and Sports Bureau gave an overview of the process of coordinating with the Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee, and a status update of comments and requests received from sports organisations in Japan and Fukushima, before the director general of the Public Works Department explained the specific nature of works to be carried out and the projected schedule for renovations.

In addition, it was proposed that the prefecture maximize the use of Sports Promotion Lottery funding to reduce prefectural expenditure, and that the planned renovations be carried out during the baseball off-season to minimize the impact on those using the stadium.

<Outline of Major Renovations>

• Improved Functionality

Replace entire field with artificial turf (current outfield is natural turf, infield is black soil), restore outer field fence
Using artificial turf should lead to improved drainage, greater convenience (e.g. useable year-round), and reduced yearly management costs

• Preventing Deterioration

Renovation of administration rooms (the broadcast room, and umpire room), toilets, shower rooms

• Barrier-free

Install wheelchair stair lifts, along with wheelchair-accessible and multi-purpose toilets.

<Schedule (Proposed)>

• Majority of reconstruction to be scheduled for baseball off-season between 2018~19 (approx. Nov-Apr)

Fukushima Baseball Dream Beyond 2020

Kōji Uehara, who played for the Chicago Cubs last year, and Takahiro Suzuki, Minamisoma native and former member of the Yomiuri Giants, led a baseball clinic at Azuma Gymnasium on Saturday, January 20th. The clinic was organised by the prefectural government and Toho Bank, with the aim of inspiring children and creating excitement within the prefecture for the Tokyo 2020 baseball and softball games in Fukushima.

Around 740 elementary and junior high school students (52 teams) from every prefecture in Japan applied for 300 spots (21 teams), and participants were decided on the day via lottery. Kōji gave tips relating to catching skills and playing catch while Takahiro taught base-running skills, making the event a valuable experience for the children.

Kōji and Takahiro also went head to head in a strikeout duel against the aces of each junior high school team, and held a talk show between themselves, where they spoke about the Olympics, the importance of effort and of being grateful to the people around you who support you such as your parents or family. In a surprising twist, Takahiro's mother, who had been spectating the event, took part at the end of the show.

Pyeongchang 2018 Live Site at Koriyama Station

Scenes of intense athletic competition at the Pyeongchang Olympics (which began on Friday, February 9th) were screened live at Koriyama station West Exit Plaza on Sunday, February 18th.

A total of five thousand people gathered around a large screen set up outside the station to watch the Japan vs US Men's Curling match in the Qualifying rounds live. The excitement in the air the moment Japan secured victory was palpable.

The event also featured a live performance by Elly from the Sandaime J Soul Brothers, a talk show by former baseball player for the Yomiuri Giants Takahiro Suzuki, and a VR wheelchair racing experience at the Experience Booth, all of which helped to create a genuine Olympic atmosphere.

A delegation from Minamisoma, a Reconstruction *Arigato* Host Town, visited partner country Djibouti, from Sunday, February 11th to Saturday, February 17th as part of the Japanese government's Host Town Survey Model Project.

The delegation included Minamisoma City Hall employees, local Karate instructors, and staff from the prefectural and national governments.

In Djibouti, the group held karate workshops at local karate dojos and junior high schools, and donated karate equipment, much to the students' delight. The delegation also visited the Secretary of State for Youth and Sport, and the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs, to express their gratitude for all of Djibouti's support in the aftermath of the 3.11 earthquake, and met with the Djibouti National Olympic Committee to discuss inviting Djibouti athletes to Minamisoma for training camps prior to Tokyo 2020.

PICK UP!It's a bit late to ask now but...
What is GAP?**Point 1****GAP stands for Good Agricultural Practice!**

Good agricultural practice refers to initiatives to abide by regulations and eliminate risk. The recognition of these initiatives by an accredited third party is called GAP certification.

Point 2**GAP Certification and Tokyo 2020**

The Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee state in their procurement standards that all food, e.g. agricultural products*, to be served during Tokyo 2020 at the Athlete's Village and media centre must have been produced in compliance with GAP standards.

One important aspect of hosting the Olympic and Paralympic games is being able to deliver them in a sustainable manner, e.g. with consideration for the future environment, and GAP certification is perfectly in line with this ethos.

The GAP initiative has already begun to spread among distributors and food manufacturers. As a result, the number of people who want to try food that has been produced with consumers and athletes in mind, and with consideration for safety and the environment may grow in future.

*In addition to agricultural products, Tokyo 2020 procurement standards also emphasise the importance of sustainability and traceability for animal and marine products, and timber.

**Point 4****Fukushima aims for most GAP certifications in Japan!**

Fukushima Prefecture has turned towards the globally recognised GAP as a means of combatting the distrust towards Fukushima agricultural products that continues to persist.

In May 2017, Fukushima Prefecture and JA Central Fukushima launched the Fukushima GAP Challenge with the aim of acquiring the most GAP certifications in Japan.

Besides being the catalyst to mend Fukushima's reputation, GAP certification is also expected to lead to improved safety of Fukushima products, as well as improvements in environmental conservation, work safety and efficiency, and agricultural administration.


**Projected Number of GAP Certifications for FY2017 (As of January 5th)**

Total: 66 (Breakdown: GLOBALG.A.P. 21, ASIAGAP 4, JGAP 38, FGAP 3)

The above total is based off of the number of certifications and applications made as of the given date. The total number of certifications this year is expected to be around six times greater than the number of certifications last year.

Point 3**Implementing GAP – A Diagram**

Producers improve their agricultural practices by repeating a process of deciding on various areas for inspection, e.g. food safety, then enacting changes, inspecting, and adjusting

Putting into Practice**Acquire GAP Certification****GLOBALG.A.P.**

An independent certification system developed by European retailers and recognised by many countries around the globe.

JGAP/ASIAGAP

An independent certification developed by, and for farmers, distributors, and academic experts from Japan.

FGAP(Fukushima GAP)

Fukushima's own official GAP certification system, which conforms to guidelines set by the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, and Fisheries.
