

Request to cooperate in the establishment of a “New Lifestyle”

1. Preventative measures against infection for daily life

- Thoroughly avoid the “Three Cs” - “Closed spaces with poor ventilation”, “Crowded places with many people nearby”, and “Close-contact settings such as close-range conversations”.
- Wear a mask.
- Practice hand hygiene including washing hands.
- Observe social distancing (people are advised to keep two metres apart as much as possible or at least one metre apart)

2. Preventative measures against infection in the workplace

- Promote efforts for reducing person-to-person contact during commuting hours including staggered work schedules and encouraging workers to commute via bicycle.
- Promote working from home (teleworking) or rotating work schedules, and using teleconferencing and other measures.

3. Preventative measures against infection related to traveling

- When you have any symptoms such as a fever, you are requested to refrain from going out or travelling between and across prefectures.
- When you travel between and across prefectures, you are requested to act carefully by checking the infection status of the prefecture or area you are going to, avoiding places as much as possible where the “Three Cs”- “Closed spaces with poor ventilation”, “Crowded places with many people nearby”, “Close-contact settings such as close-range conversations” overlap and places without thorough preventative measures in place, and take thorough preventative measures such as wearing a mask, etc.
- When you have to visit areas where the risk of getting infected is relatively high with new infections continuously being confirmed or someone in your family is returning home from one of those areas, etc., you are requested to cooperate in minimising the risk of spreading the infection with measures such as using contact tracing applications and keeping track of where you or your family have been for the two weeks since arriving in Fukushima, etc.

Staged easing of the request to refrain from going out (including traveling between and across prefectures)

Actions based on the “New Lifestyle”: Thorough and continued practice of basic preventative measures including hand washing, mask wearing, and refraining from going out with presenting symptoms such as a fever.

② 1 June - 18 June	The request to refrain from going out no longer applies However, refrain from traveling between and across the 5 prefectures where the state of emergency was lifted on 25 May for non-urgent and nonessential reasons as much as possible.	
③ 19 June - 9 July	The request to refrain from going out no longer applies	The request to refrain from going out no longer applies
④ 10 July - 31 July		Promote attracting visitors to Fukushima Prefecture from other prefectures. Ensure social distancing at tourist spots.
